

RESOLUTION RATIFYING AND AUTHORIZING JOINT APPLICATIONS BY FORSYTH COUNTY AND WINSTON-SALEM/FORSYTH COUNTY SCHOOLS FOR \$3,854,900.00 FROM THE PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING CAPITAL FUND (EDUCATION LOTTERY FUND) TO RETIRE A PORTION OF THE COUNTY'S SCHOOL BOND INDEBTEDNESS

WHEREAS N.C.G.S. 18C-164 provides that revenue of the Education Lottery Fund is to be distributed to the Public School Building Capital Fund, which was created to assist county governments in meeting their public school building capital needs;

WHEREAS monies in the said Public School Building Capital Fund are to be used for capital outlay projects and in the event the county does not need all or part of the funds allocated to it for capital outlay projects, the unneeded funds may be used to retire any indebtedness incurred by the county for public school facilities;

WHEREAS on January 22, 2019, the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Board of Education adopted a Resolution indicating that \$3,854,900.00 in North Carolina Education Lottery proceeds have been allocated to Forsyth County which are unnecessary for the planning, construction, reconstruction, enlargement, improvement, repair, or renovation of public school buildings, for the purchase of land for public school buildings or for equipment to implement a local school technology plan, and recommends that the funds be used to retire a portion of the indebtedness incurred by the County for public school construction projects; and

WHEREAS the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools are therefore willing to submit a joint application with Forsyth County to the Public School Building Capital Fund (Education Lottery Fund) to receive \$3,854,900.00 to be used to retire a portion of the County's School Bond indebtedness.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Chairman and or the County Manager and the Clerk to the Board to execute the necessary documents, on behalf of Forsyth County, to submit joint applications with the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools to the Public School Building Capital Fund to receive \$3,854,900.00, in Education Lottery Funds, which are not needed for public school capital outlay projects and can be used to retire a portion of the County's 2006 School Bond indebtedness, subject to a pre-audit certificate thereon by the County Chief Financial Officer, if applicable, and approval as to form and legality by the County Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution ratifying interlocal cooperation between Forsyth County and the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Board of Education is hereby spread upon the minutes of the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners.

WHEREAS, the lottery has a yearly forecast of projected sales and deposits into the school accounts;

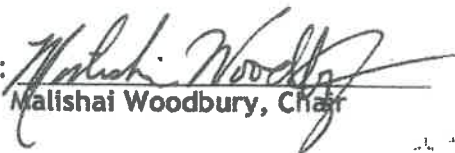
WHEREAS, the estimated 2018-19 lottery distribution is \$3,854, 900.

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Instruction allows the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Board of Education to obligate the estimated lottery distribution to the County of Forsyth, while the County of Forsyth may only make withdrawals up to the amount in the Fund; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.C.G.S. § 18C-164. The Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Board of Education believes \$3,854, 900 of lottery funds should be used as funds become available to retire school bond indebtedness from the 2013 and 2015 refundings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE WINSTON-SALEM/FORSYTH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION that it hereby requests the sum of \$3,854,900 be used by the County of Forsyth to retire indebtedness incurred by the County for public school facilities arising from the 2013 and 2015 refunding bonds.

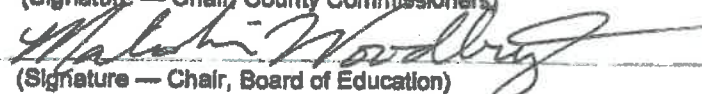
